

2013 Erie County Demographic Profile

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
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Note: The primary sources of data and information for this profile are the Erie County Department of Health, the Pennsylvania State Data Center, and the United States Census Bureau (Population Estimates Program, American FactFinder, and the 2007-2011 American Community Survey). With the exception of the Erie County Department of Health, sources are not responsible for any of the analyses, interpretations, or conclusions that appear herein.

Erie County and Its Municipalities


Figure 1. Erie County, Pennsylvania

Erie County is located in northwestern Pennsylvania on the south shore of Lake Erie (Figure 1). Established in 1800, it is the Commonwealth's lone link to the Great Lakes. Erie County is bordered on the north by Lake Erie and the province of Ontario, Canada, on the south by Crawford County, Pennsylvania, on the west by Ashtabula County, Ohio, and on the east by Chautauqua County, New York and Warren County, Pennsylvania. Erie is the largest of Pennsylvania's 67 counties, with a total area of 1,558.2 square miles. Overall, 799.2 square miles are land (1.8% of Pennsylvania's total land area), and 759.0 square miles are water (57.9% of Pennsylvania's total water area).

Erie County's population totaled 280,646 residents in 2012. This amounted to 2.2% of Pennsylvania's population of 12,763,536, and placed Erie as the 14th most populous county in the Commonwealth. The county population was classified as 80.0% urban and 20.0% rural in the 2010 Census.

The 38 municipalities of Erie County are comprised of 2 cities, 22 townships, and 14 boroughs (Figure 2). The county seat is located in the City of Erie, which is currently the fourth most populous municipality in the state, behind Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, and Allentown.

Erie County’s 38 municipalities vary greatly in total population, size (land area), and population density (Table 1). In 2012, municipality populations ranged from a low of 217 residents in Elgin Borough to a high of 101,047 residents in the City of Erie, land areas ranged from a low of 0.3 square miles in Wattsburg Borough to a high of 50.0 square miles in Waterford Township, and population densities ranged from a low of 38.7 persons per square mile in Amity Township to a high of 6,239.6 persons per square mile in Wesleyville Borough. The overall population density of Erie County was 351.2 persons per square mile.

The ten largest county municipalities in 2012 were the City of Erie (101,047), Millcreek Township (54,093), Harborcreek Township (17,192), Fairview Township (10,200), Summit Township (6,725), the City of Corry (6,560), Edinboro Borough (6,447), North East Township (6,410), Girard Township (5,083), and Greene Township (4,708). Taken together, these municipalities accounted for more than three-quarters (77.8%) of the total county population.



Population by Age and Sex

Of the 280,646 people residing in Erie County in 2012, 142,437 (50.8%) were female and 138,209 (49.2%) were male. With respect to age, 72,299 (25.8%) residents were under 20 years, 89,051 (31.7%) were ages 20 to 44 years, 77,165 (27.5%) were ages 45 to 64 years, and 42,131 (15.0%) were 65 years and older (Figure 3, Table 2).

Since the year 2000, Erie County's population has experienced an interesting transition. The number of residents under 45 years of age decreased from 177,932 to 161,350 (a drop of 9.3%), while the number of residents 45 years and older increased from 102,871 to 119,296 (an increase of 16.0%) (Table 3).

The population of Erie County is aging. The median age in Erie County increased to a new high of 38.8 years in 2012, up from 36.2 years in 2000, and 32.9 years in 1990. The median age for males and females in 2012 were 37.3 and 40.3 years, respectively. The aging of the baby boom generation (people born between 1946 and 1964) into older age groups, declining birth rates, and improved mortality are some of the key contributors to the observed increase in median age.

Population by Race and Hispanic Origin

Of the 280,646 people residing in Erie County in 2012, 249,864 (89.0%) were White, 20,808 (7.4%) were Black or African American, 3,504 (1.2%) were Asian, 665 (0.2%) were American Indian or Alaska Native, 123 (0.04%) were Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, and 5,682 (2.0%) were classified as Two or More Races. A total of 10,170 (3.6%) residents were Hispanic, of any race (Table 4).

Erie County's racial and Hispanic composition continues to grow more diverse. From July 1, 2000 to July 1, 2012, the number of Whites in Erie County decreased by 3.1%, the Black population increased by 18.1%, the number of Asians increased by 77.1%, the number of residents classified as Two or More Races increased by 107.1%, and the Hispanic population rose by 64.8% (Table 4). However, as is shown in Table 5 for the combined years 2007-2011, the bulk of Erie County's Black and Hispanic populations live in the City of Erie (80.4% and 65.7% of the total Black and Hispanic populations, respectively). Millcreek Township, Conneaut Township (home of the State Correctional Institution at Albion), and Harborcreek Township are other notable residential locales for these two populations.

Native and Foreign-Born Residents

Of the 279,824 people living in Erie County in 2007-2011, 269,004 (96.1%) were native residents of the United States and 10,820 (3.9%) were foreign-born (Table 6). Overall, four out of five (79.4%) county residents were born in Pennsylvania, and nine out of ten (90.0%) residents were born in either Pennsylvania or another state in the Northeast or Midwest. Of the 10,820 foreign-born residents, 5,374 (50.0%) were naturalized U.S. citizens.

Erie County's 10,820 foreign-born residents come from all over the world. In 2007-2011, the twenty leading places of birth for the foreign-born population were Ukraine (910), Bosnia and Herzegovina (748), Mexico (635), Germany (558), Vietnam (537), Canada (481), China (427), India (331), Russia (322), Italy (299), Poland (242), Iraq (226), England (216), Jamaica (189), Korea (173), Sudan (173), Philippines (173), Romania (151), Colombia (146), and Portugal (146). These places collectively accounted for nearly two-thirds (65.5%) of the total foreign-born population.

Housing and Household Characteristics

There were 109,138 households in Erie County in 2007-2011, with an average household size of 2.5 persons. Overall, there were 69,518 (64.2%) family households, with an average size of 3.1 persons, and 38,785 (35.8%) nonfamily households, with an average size of 1.2 persons. Selected housing and household characteristics are presented in Table 7.

Employment and Occupations

The Erie County civilian labor force population aged 16 years and older was 138,923 persons in 2007-2011, of which 127,332 (91.7%) were employed and 11,591 (8.3%) were unemployed. Among those employed, 62,226 (48.9%) were female and 65,106 (51.1%) were male. The five major occupational categories for the civilian labor force population are shown in Figure 4. Table 8 provides a summary of the major occupational categories by sex and median earnings in the past 12 months.

Figure 4. Occupational Categories for the Erie County Civilian Labor Force Population, 2007-2011



Income

In 2007-2011, Erie County household income distribution levels differed substantially for family and nonfamily households (Table 9). Overall, 27.7% of all households had income below \$25,000 and 14.5% had income above \$100,000 in the past 12 months. Nearly half (49.1%) of nonfamily households had income below \$25,000.

The median household income was \$44,503, the median family household income was \$56,906, and the median nonfamily household income was \$25,449. Median family and nonfamily household incomes were substantially higher for White versus Black and Hispanic householders.

The Erie County per capita income was \$23,321 for the total population, \$24,781 for Whites, \$11,330 for Blacks, and \$10,777 for Hispanics.

Poverty

In 2007-2011, 15.8% of Erie County residents lived below the poverty level and 23.4% of children under 18 years lived below the poverty level (Table 10). Poverty levels were markedly higher for Blacks (40.3%) and Hispanics (35.9%) compared to Whites (13.2%).

Among families with related children under 18 years, high poverty levels were observed for both female (41.0%) and male (30.8%) single parent families compared to married couple (6.7%) families.

Overall, poverty rates varied greatly among Erie County's 38 municipalities during the period 2007-2011 (Table 11). The five highest poverty rates were observed in the City of Erie (26.1%), Edinboro Borough (24.9%), North East Borough (24.9%), the City of Corry (24.5%), and Platea Borough (21.9%), while the five lowest rates were observed in Elk Creek Township (2.9%), McKean Borough (3.9%), Summit Township (4.0%), Franklin Township (4.8%), and Fairview Township (4.9%).

Of the 267,196 Erie County residents for whom poverty status was determined during 2007-2011, 42,157 (15.8%) lived below the poverty level in the past 12 months. The municipalities with the largest number of people living below the poverty level were the City of Erie (25,138 residents, 59.6% of the total), Millcreek Township (3,925 residents, 9.3% of the total), the City of Corry (1,578 residents, 3.7% of the total), Harborcreek Township (1,389 residents, 3.3% of the total), and Edinboro Borough (1,349 residents, 3.2% of the total).

Of the 62,626 Erie County residents under the age of 18 for whom poverty status was determined during 2007-2011, 14,653 (23.4%) lived below the poverty level in the past 12 months. The municipalities with the largest number of children living below the poverty level were the City of Erie (9,568 residents, 65.3% of the total), Millcreek Township (955 residents, 6.5% of the total), the City of Corry (647 residents, 4.4% of the total), North East Borough (370 residents, 2.5% of the total) and Harborcreek Township (261 residents, 1.8% of the total).

Education

The total estimated school enrollment for the Erie County population 3 years and over was 74,353 students in 2007-2011. Overall, 7,612 (10.2%) of students were in nursery school, preschool, or kindergarten, 27,764 (37.3%) were in elementary school grades 1 to 8, 15,566 (20.9%) were in high school grades 9 to 12, 19,936 (26.8%) were in college, and 3,475 (4.7%) were in graduate or professional school.

Of the 74,353 total enrolled students in Erie County in 2007-2011, 74.1% were enrolled in public school and 25.9% were enrolled in private school. Public school enrollments were 68.7% for nursery school, preschool, or kindergarten, 87.2% for elementary school, 84.5% for high school, 56.5% for college, and 35.9% for graduate or professional school.

In 2007-2011, 89.5% of Erie County residents 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school, 23.6% had a bachelor's degree or higher, and 8.9% had earned a graduate or professional degree. Striking differences were observed for high school and college educational attainment by race and Hispanic origin (Table 12).
