Who can I call?

You can obtain information about these services several different ways. Someone at each of the numbers below should be able to direct you to the appropriate referral. If ever you are experiencing a crisis, contact Crisis Services at 814-456-2014 or toll free at 1-800-300-9558.

If you have a Medical Assistance Card, it is likely you are eligible for behavioral health services paid by the Erie County HealthChoices services provider, Community Care Behavioral Health, located at 1314 Griswold Plaza Erie, Pa 16501. **Community Care's Member Services line is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week at the toll-free number 1-855-224-1777, 1-877-877-3580 (TTY) or 1-866-229-3187 (En Espanol). This includes children who were physically or sexually abused, witnessed domestic violence, witnessed or experienced any other type of violent crime, experienced separation from or death of a loved one, experienced traumatic medical treatment, or witnessed or experienced any type of trauma (I.E. Residential Treatment Facility Services (Youth) (HC)	Treatment and care for individuals under 21 years of age with serious mental health diagnoses.
