ROLL CALL ON MINUTES – FIORE LEONE – ABSENT

MOTION APPROVED UNANIMOUSLY BY MEMBERS PRESENT.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS UPDATE:

HOUSE BILL 1062 (ELIMINATION OF COUNTY SHARE REQUIREMENT)

Passed the State House by a unanimous vote and referred to the Senate Committee (Health and Welfare). The Board will be asked to contact the committee and our local State Senators. It is unclear what will happen to the \$20 million if the County Share goes away. We should receive more information at the PACAH Conference in April

LIMITED IGT

All the counties with County homes have done what was required/requested to move the process forward. The proposed regulation appeared in the PA Bulletin in February for comments. The required State Plan Amendment with CMS was also submitted in February. Specific amounts for additional funding for participating counties are not available, however, Erie County's projected amount is between \$1.25 and \$1.36 million. Some of this money was budgeted. The Pay For Performance program through which PRM receives approximately \$200,000 annually has not been put in the State Budget. We are not sure what the State plans on doing but could be more of a wash than a gain.

2016 BUDGET PROJECTION/REVISED

We closed 2015 last week and hopefully in the next two (2) weeks will be getting the first two (2) months of 2016 together so we will have an eight (8) months trend to review. The last six (6) months of 2015 and the first two (2) months of 2016. We will be reviewing these eight (8) months to see if our budget projections are holding true moving forward.

The census in the last two (2) months of 2015 took a drop. The census has increased during the first few months of 2016. The census is averaging 280-285 residents a day. We budgeted for 285 residents.

We have reinstated our External Marketing Committee. We modified our marketing plan to reflect the closing of the East Facility, refocusing our marketing on a more defined area that is a little more West than before.

VA CONTRACT

We are working on securing a contract with the Veteran's Administration. We were able to get a contact name and exploring getting Senator Casey's office involved.

PENSION

Hopefully, we will be in a position to change the Pension Plan designation from a private to a governmental plan sometime this year. Attorney Joseph added that Senator Casey's staff felt PRM had a very good case based on the material that was sent into the Internal Revenue Service.

We recently received the updated minimum required contribution from Northwest Retirement Services. The amount is \$1,161,730 of which \$15,000 has been deposited. We received good news that the additional \$15,000 will not be required this year.

Mr. Donald Boetger of the Northwest Retirement Services explained the Actuarial Valuation and how it affects PRM's funding and premiums.

Discussion was held on the cost for each participant and liability.

Attorney Joseph has sent a letter requesting a refund on our premium.

Kathy Dahlkemper asked how far back can PRM request a refund on premiums.

Attorney Joseph stated six (6) years.

ANNUAL SURVEY

Our annual Department of Health Licensure Survey was completed on March 11th, 2016. We should receive the deficiencies on or after March 18th. We will submit Plan of Correction (POC) by March 23rd, 2016.

Mr. Breneman asked if PRM had the same surveyors as last year.

Mr. Smith stated the same surveyors visit every year. Five (5) surveyors for five (5) days. A lot of the issues dealt with documentation.

Mr. Breneman asked if the East Facility played a part in this survey.

Mr. Smith stated no that the East Facility's final survey was completed when the last resident left last June.

Mr. Breneman asked if the Board could get copies of the Annual Survey.

Mr. Smith stated yes.

Mr. Breneman questioned the Worker's Compensation claim relating to Dietary's slip and falls.

Mr. Smith stated that things are in place to prevent the slip and falls. Mats are in place. We continue working on other problems with the water spraying on the floors.

Mr. Breneman questioned the prescription cost. Is this for resident only? Have we considered switching vendors to save dollars on prescriptions?

Mr. Smith stated that those numbers are for residents only. Vendors were switched last fall. Our cost savings will be approximately \$30,000/over a five (5) year period. The other area of concern is the Health Insurance and Prescription plan for employees. The number of employees has decreased since the East closing but the costs remain the same or increased in some areas.

CONSOLIDATION

Twelve (12) employees remain on the displaced workers status. These employees fill in for employees on FMLA, overtime, and vacation.

As the number of displaced workers go down we are finding holes in our schedules. We are working on finding temporary employees but unfortunately not enough people are qualified for the Nursing Department.

Next year, with the impact displaced workers filling in for workers, we will be doing an analysis and may want to increase the number of permanent employees especially Nurse Aides positions. It's still cheaper to pay someone their hourly rate with the benefit packet then someone else receiving overtime at twice their hourly wage.

One (1) employee remains on Unemployment Compensation as of March 10th, 2016. This claim should be closed shortly.

Dr. Foust asked have you received feedback on the County Share from the House side.

Mr. Smith stated HB1062 moved to the Senate but will take time. He was not sure who the Chairman is at this time. PACAH works with the Committee and Chairman of the Health and Welfare Committee. Hopefully will get an update during the PACAH Conference.

Dr. Foust asked if the IGT goes away will this change the bottom line.

Mr. Smith stated PRM would not receive \$1.25 - \$1.36 million.

Dr. Foust asked what the County Share responsibility is.

Mike Anderson stated approximately \$1 million. Currently they are negotiating with DHS on a split of funds.

Mr. Smith stated he was unsure where the \$20 million will go and what it covers with the Legacy Program. Moving forward with the IGT that will happen and it's the first time that it was put in the State Budget.

Kathy Dahlkemper asked when employees retire do they still receive health insurance paid by PRM?

Mr. Smith stated yes if the employees retire before age of 65.

Mrs. Dahlkemper stated that as of 1992 the County removed that benefit from their employees.

Mr. Smith stated the employee only receives individual coverage.

Mrs. Dahlkemper stated that any PRM employee that retire before 65 gets individual health care benefits until they turn 65. However the county employees that retire before 65 do not receive this benefit. Was this every brought forward when the county made the change? Not sure of the cost involved.

Mr. Smith stated that this is a contract issue with the Union, and would need to be negotiated.

Mike Anderson stated less than twelve (12) employees are covered. Cost per year around \$1,000 per employee.

Mrs. Dahlkemper asked if the non-bargaining still employees get this benefits.

Mr. Smith stated yes.

Mrs. Dahlkemper stated this concerns her that the county tried to keep the benefits the same as PRM.

The meeting adjourned at 6:03 p.m.

II. ISSUES

A. LIMITED IGT

The transfer of \$4,390,879 from Erie County took place on June 1st, 2016. PRM is scheduled to receive \$6,684,242 from DHS on June 22nd, 2016. PRM will return the Erie County Contribution and retain \$2,293,363 as payment for the Limited IGT and MD01 from DHS. This payment is approximately \$50,000 more than what was projected when the 2016 budget was approved and is part of 2015-16 State budget.

We are hopeful that a second Limited IGT can be completed prior to December 31st, 2016 as part of the 2016-2017 State budget.

B. HOUSE BILL 1062-ELIMINATION OF THE COUNTY SHARE REQUIREMENT

We have received no new news on progress in moving the bill out of the Senate Health and Welfare Committee. Representatives from Chairperson Vance's district plan to meet with her to encourage her to move the bill forward. Her district includes counties with two (2) County Homes.

We will be contacting our State Senators for support in passing the bill in the Senate and moving it to the Governor's office for signature. It should be noted that DHS does not support the bill as it will result in the reduction of \$18 million from their revenues.

C. APRIL 2016 OPERATIONS REPORT

Revenue for the month was \$138,190 below budget projections due to the census and Medicaid Mix (89%). Expenses were generally in line or lower than budget with the exception of Employee Health Insurance (\$84,377 over for the month, \$289,240 YTD), Worker Compensation (\$22,984 over for the month, \$105,679 YTD), and Employee Prescription Costs (\$34,765 for the month, \$78,467 YTD).

The net result of the above is a loss for April of \$149,081, YTD (\$599,810).

We continue to market the facility and services with direct contact and media (print and social). PRM is also participating in the County Wellness Plan and programs.

E. PENSION DESIGNATION

The regulations for the process of changing our pension designation from private to governmental are scheduled for release in June or July 2016. We are prepared to submit our request as soon as they are released.

The change in designation will result in a reduction of the required contribution of

\$500,000 to \$600,000 annually and the elimination of the PBGC contribution, projected at \$365,000 next year.

We have requested the refund of prior PBGC premiums (\$800,000 for the past six (6) years).

F. 2016 BUDGET

We are scheduling a meeting to review the last six (6) months of 2015 and first four (4) to five (5) months of 2016 operations to revise the 2016 budget projections as needed. Census/revenue and Employee Health and Prescription costs will be factors in the discussion.

G. ANNUAL LICENSURE SURVEYS

The PA Department of Health conducted the Life Safety and Nursing Facility reviews and visits finding PRM in substantial compliance. We have submitted the application for licensure renew and it is being processed.

H. CONSOLIDATION

Less than ten employees remain in displaced status. Due to the need for replacement employees to cover leaves of absence and vacations (the role the displaced employees filled) we are again recruiting Nursing staff.


